**Ensuring a Safe and Fun Halloween:

MILLCREEK. As Halloween approaches, excitement fills the air with the anticipation of costumes, candy, and spooky fun. Unified Police Department (UPD) and Millcreek are committed to ensuring that this festive occasion remains safe for everyone in our community. Here are some important Halloween safety tips to help you and your family enjoy a fun and secure holiday.

Trick-or-Treating Safety

1. **Plan Your Route:** Before heading out, plan a safe route in familiar neighborhoods. Stick to well-lit streets and avoid cutting through alleys or across vacant lots.
2. **Trick-or-Treat Before Dusk:** Aim to complete trick-or-treating before it gets too dark. This helps ensure better visibility and safety for everyone involved.
3. **Stay Visible:** Equip your children with flashlights or glow sticks and add reflective tape to their costumes to increase visibility. Bright-colored costumes are also recommended.
4. **Use the Buddy System:** Children should never trick-or-treat alone. Always go in groups or with a trusted adult.
5. **Inspect Treats:** Examine all treats at home before consuming them. Discard any unwrapped, homemade, or suspicious-looking items.
6. **Stay on Sidewalks:** Walk on sidewalks whenever possible. If there are no sidewalks, walk on the edge of the road facing traffic and avoid crossing mid-block.
7. **Look Both Ways:** Remind children to look both ways before crossing the street and to use crosswalks whenever possible. Don't run into the street.

8. **Respect Homeowners:** Only approach homes that have their porch lights on, and never enter a stranger's home or car.

Costume Safety

1. **Choose Safe Costumes:** Make sure costumes are flame-resistant and fit properly to prevent trips and falls. Avoid masks that obstruct vision; consider using face paint instead.
2. **Safe Accessories:** Use soft, flexible props for any costume accessories to prevent accidental injuries.
3. **Make Your Costume Visible:** Add reflective tape to costumes and carry a flashlight or glow stick to ensure you're seen by drivers and other pedestrians.

Home Safety for Homeowners

1. **Clear Pathways:** Ensure your yard and pathways are well-lit and free from obstacles to prevent falls.
2. **Pet Safety:** Keep pets indoors to prevent them from becoming frightened or aggressive with trick-or-treaters.

Getting Visual at the Library

The Millcreek Arts Council and Salt Lake County Library Millcreek Branch are excited to start November with a new exhibit at the Library at 2266 Evergreen Ave. The artwork of Wendy Reed will be displayed throughout the month.

A reception will be held at the library from 6-6:45 PM on Friday, November 1st. We hope you will join us for an evening of art, light refreshments and musical accompaniment by Nathan Spenser.

Wendy Reed's journey into watercolor painting began nine years ago. At that time, she says, "my boys were scattered across the country, and I found myself in an empty house except for Dusty, my floppy-eared Golden Retriever. The idea of painting had always intrigued me, but it wasn't until April 2015 that I mustered the courage to enroll in my first class at the Visual Art Institute.



"I was filled with fears of rejection, but it was there that I met Barbara Kidd. She was not just an instructor but a mentor and a friend. Her guidance and support have been instrumental in my growth as an artist.

"Painting with watercolors has been a transformation. I've always been a tightly structured person, a bit of a control freak with the need to find a place for everything and everything has a place. Watercolors, however, are anything but structured. They've taught me to let go, to allow water to flow where it wants and colors to follow. As an artist, I drop them in place and surrender ultimate

control to the vagaries of the paper, paint pigment, temperature, and water soaking and sliding on the paper. I can paint the same scene daily for a week and end up with seven significantly different paintings.

"Some of my best work is the result of happy accidents. Painting has also deepened my appreciation for nature. The segregated layers of a rose are each tinged by the sun's shadow. Clouds, sunrises, and sunsets. The blush on a baby's cheek. Mountains and their canyons. Timbered and snowcapped slopes."

3300 South

2000 East Storm Drain Maintenance Project

Millcreek will address a road safety concern with a storm drain system located at 2000 East, north of 3300 South. The reconstruction will involve removing and replacing the broken pipe under the road. This reconstruction is expected to improve road safety and the storm drain system in the affected area. Construction crews will begin work as early as Monday, October 29, and the project will continue through the end of November.

What to Expect During Construction:

- Work will occur during daytime hours from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Construction vehicles, equipment, and traffic cones in the area.
- Intermittent traffic shifts and delays
- Increased noise, dust, and vibration






Salt Lake City Department of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) is constructing a new large diameter water line from the Terminal Storage Reservoir at approximately 3500 East along Metro Way to Grace Street at 3075 East.



Schedule

Construction: Fall 2024 – Summer 2025



Project Purpose

Phase 3 is a segment of the 6-mile water conveyance line that will provide an additional water supply to supplement existing wells in the Sugarhouse and Millcreek area as well as maintain SLCDPU's standard of reliability while meeting future growth water demands in the Salt Lake valley.

What to Expect During Construction

- Construction activities will occur Monday through Friday during daylight hours.
- Relocation of existing utilities such as small diameter waterlines, sewer lines, and gas lines will begin as early as October. Residents and businesses will be notified in advance of any water or utility interruption.
- Increased noise, vibrations and dust.
- Temporary on-street parking restrictions and driveway access interruptions.
- SLC lot clearing at 3127 S 3380 E.
- Temporary road closures, lane restrictions, and detours are expected.
- Work will be constructed in sections. Residents and businesses will be notified prior to construction beginning in their area.
