Detective Creno is assigned as the Mental Health Detective for the Millcreek Precinct. She is tasked with investigating, assisting and providing resources for those in mental health crisis. Detective Creno is the only Mental Health Detective in the Millcreek Precinct and is responsible for a very significant case load. She regularly assists other precincts with their mental health cases and often conducts follow-up in those cases. In addition to her primary assignment, Detective Creno is always the first to assist patrol with calls for service and will generally reassign the call to herself and follow the case through to its conclusion.

During the 2024-2025 training period, Detective Creno developed and taught a Mental Health training class for the entire Unified Police Department. The preparation and teaching of the class took a considerable amount of time and effort. She had to accommodate each precinct and every shift department wide. Detective Creno not only managed to take on this very large extra task, but also did so while maintaining her current work queue with no drop off in service to the community.

The Unified Police Department is also beginning a new chapter in helping those with mental illness by hiring a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. Detective Creno's expertise and experience is relied on heavily as we take on this new challenge. She has been instrumental in developing what the program will entail, what the policies will be and was involved in the selection of the LCSW.

Thanks to her outstanding work ethic, combined with her mental health knowledge, training and experience, as well as her willingness to help others, Detective Tracey Creno is the 2024 Officer of the year.

UPD officers are often faced with residents who are experiencing a mental health crisis or are calling for assistance for someone who is. These calls are always difficult and must be handled with extreme delicacy. As you can read in the citation above, to add to Detective Creno's work, the UPD is in the process of hiring a Licensed Clinical Social Worker in the very near future.

The UPD and Millcreek look forward to this addition that will undoubtedly be very important and valuable to our residents.
