### **Youth Council Members Meet and Mingle with City Council and Legislators at Local Officials Day**

MILLCREEK. Each year on the second day of the legislative session, the Utah League of Cities and Towns (ULCT) hosts city Youth Council members and legislators for a day on the hill. Members also attended panel discussions on the Utah legislative college internship program, advocacy, and legislative processes.

During lunch, members talked with their representatives, got to know them, and learned why they chose to run for office.

## MESSAGES FROM OUR PARTNERS

The Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District (WFWRD) Urges Residents to Keep Recycling Clean

### Keep Recycling Clean: How We Measure Contamination

Each month we collaborate with our recycling partner to process your single-stream recycling.

Through "Sample Sorts," we assess contamination rates by sorting a portion of the load into two categories:

- Accepted Recyclables: cardboard, paper, metal cans, plastic bottles, jugs, and tubs
- Non-Accepted Items and Garbage: items that cannot be recycled

We weigh each material and calculate the contamination rate. Recyclables are processed into new products and while contaminants are sent to the landfill.

Reducing contamination lowers disposal fees and minimizes environmental impact by reducing transportation trips. Please review the list of accepted items to avoid contamination and ensure more materials are recycled. Let's work together to keep contamination low!

**Public Comment Policy and Procedure:** The purpose of public comment is to allow citizens to address items on the agenda. In general, the Chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
