

Utah's format of Dual Language Immersion is quite simple, but the results are extraordinary. For students in these programs, instruction is divided between two high-quality creative classrooms: one in English, and one in the second language. It all begins in first grade with simple steps of learning. It culminates with the acquisition of a second language and significantly increased cultural awareness.

"Students enrolled in the program become a part of a small community," said Mill Creek principal Ann Kane. "It's not just a classroom style; these students take part in cultural activities and community events to really immerse themselves in the language they're learning."

In 2008, the first cohort of DLI students in Utah entered first grade ready to make education history in our state. Flash forward to today, these same students are now entering college, having earned university-level credits, a Seal of Biliteracy on their high school transcript, and invaluable language skills for the job market and global community.  - List personal contact information in case additional info is required
- Or call the City Offices at 801-214-2700 and let us know
- If the size or location of a pothole is creating a serious safety concern after hours or on weekends, contact Emergency Operations at 385-468-6101.
- If a pothole is created due to a broken waterline or utility problem, we will notify the proper agency.

Pothole repairs are prioritized based on location and are completed weather-permitting and when materials are available

APPLICATIONS IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD.



MILLCREEK. Millcreek wants to keep residents informed about building permit applications going on in our neighborhoods. Adjoining neighbors receive a mailer informing them about the proposed project. The local community councils generally have a chance to review applications at their public meetings, and then the Planning Commission will have a second public meeting. Sometimes the City Council also takes a look at a proposed project in a third public meeting.

The city has begun to place A-frame signs on the property itself, like the one in the picture above. If you see such a sign in your neighborhood, that is a good place to obtain information about what is being proposed. You can also always call the City to find out what's happening. 801-214-2700.

This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
