Mayor Silvestrini Applauds UPD for Professionalism During Traffic Stop Made by ICE Officers

MILLCREEK. Mayor Silvestrini thanked the Unified Police Department earlier this week for its handling of a January 26th traffic stop that Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) officers made near the Millcreek Walmart on 900 East. Fallout resulting from the UPD's investigation of the incident, along with the mayor's email to ICE insisting upon an internal investigation, has generated quite a bit of press

MILLCREEK, UTAH: February 4, 2025: Unified Police Department Statement on Traffic Stop Involving ICE Agents

On January 26, 2025, at approximately 8:14 AM, the Unified Police Department (UPD) of Greater Salt Lake was called to assist Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) with a traffic stop near 4600 South and 900 East. Upon arrival, UPD officers were unable to locate ICE agents at the reported location. Dispatch then directed officers near the area of 4900 South 900 East in Murray, Utah.

Upon arrival, UPD officers were informed by ICE agents that the driver in question had allegedly swerved toward them with his vehicle. However, when UPD officers sought clarification on the charges, they were unable to obtain a clear response from ICE agents. During these interactions, the individual had been placed in handcuffs and UPD officers voiced concerns and recommended the immediate removal of the restraints.

During the interaction, the driver, who appeared emotional, expressed distress over alleged threats made by the ICE agents. He admitted to yelling and honking at the agents but denied swerving towards them. ICE agents requested UPD officers to cite the driver, UPD clarified they had not witnessed the incident, the ICE agents would need to sign as complainants and testify in court.

While officers gathered statements from the ICE agents, two of the three agents declined to provide written statements. The agents then suggested instead of filing charges, issuing a citation for failure to yield to an emergency vehicle. UPD issued the driver a citation for failure to yield to an emergency vehicle and released the driver.

Review of Surveillance Footage & Findings

The following day, UPD officers retrieved surveillance footage from nearby businesses to verify the claims made by ICE agents. The footage did not show the driver swerving toward the ICE agents. As a result of this review, UPD dismissed the citation issued to the driver. UPD command staff subsequently contacted ICE officials to express concerns regarding the inaccuracies and inconsistencies in their agents' statements.

The Unified Police Department remains committed to transparency, accountability, and upholding public trust. We take allegations of misconduct seriously and have escalated our concerns to the appropriate federal authorities.

Furthermore, we reaffirm our department's long-standing policy on immigration enforcement:

- UPD does not enforce immigration laws, but we will respond to requests for assistance for officer and public safety.
- Our priority is to maintain safe communities, where trust and cooperation between law enforcement and residents are essential.
- We want to ensure that concerns over immigration status never prevent individuals from seeking help from law enforcement, particularly if they are victims or witnesses of crimes.

Our law enforcement leaders remain dedicated to these principles and deeply value the trust placed in us by our communities. Your support helps us continue our mission to serve and protect.

We are proud of the way our Unified Police officers handled this incident on-scene and in their subsequent investigation. They de-escalated a volatile situation, sorted through conflicting stories and ultimately determined that no charges against the detained driver were warranted.

Both Millcreek city government and UPD want Millcreek residents to know that the civil rights of people in our city will be respected, and we never want anyone to be afraid to report a crime or seek the assistance of our police. We will also not shy away from reacting if or when we believe other agencies are violating

civil rights within our city.

While we respect the role of ICE and other federal officers to detain and deport violent criminals and convicted felons who are in our country without status or documentation, it is outside UPD's jurisdiction to enforce immigration laws. Our officers may assist federal agencies upon request in serving warrants or when circumstances place federal officers in danger, but our residents and visitors should be confident that our officers will follow their training and do their jobs while respecting civil liberties in Millcreek.
