Project Purpose: Millcreek, in collaboration with Slow the Flow, Salt Lake County, Utah Water Ways, and other partners, aims to create a residential example landscape that showcases a waterwise Utah yard. This project will educate the public on transforming their yards into beautiful, Utah-happy landscapes.

We are looking for a typical front yard with a living lawn or a new construction backyard ready for transformation. The goal is to create exemplary yards that others can emulate. Homeowners will offer their landscape as a canvas for our partners to demonstrate attractive, climate-friendly designs that comply with Millcreek's landscape ordinance.

Benefits for Participant: Participant will receive a professionally designed and installed landscape at no cost, provided by a licensed, experienced contractor.

Promotion: The transformation process will be documented through professional photography and filming, potentially for up to five years. The project will be featured in a statewide water conservation campaign and shared through various media channels. Participants agree to occasional tours, learning events, and sharing water data with project partners for up to five years.



CONSTRUCTION UPDATES



Intersection Improvement at Columbia Avenue and State Street

MILLCREEK. Spring is here! As the weather starts to cooperate, Millcreek will kick off its first capital improvement project of the year. The project focuses on the intersection of Columbia Avenue and State Street. It is designed to enhance pedestrian safety by extending the sidewalk and upgrading the pedestrian access ramp. It aims to continue our mission of improving pedestrian safety by making access to the busy corridor of State Street easier.

The project's total budget is \$205,000. The primary funding source is the Utah State TAP Grant, which amounts to \$123,000. The city provided the remainder of the funds.

Construction activities commenced this week. Crews expect to remove the existing asphalt layer in preparation for sidewalk installation starting as early as Monday, March 17*.

Residents, businesses, and travelers in the area may experience the following:

- Construction activities taking place during daytime hours (7 a.m. – 5 p.m.)
- Increased noise, dust, and vibration
- Intermittent road closures and traffic shifts
- Staging of construction equipment, materials, and traffic control

During the February 5, 2025 Granite School District Board of Education meeting, the board approved an elementary boundary and closure study for "Area 5."

Area 5 includes the following elementary schools, listed in alphabetical order: Cottonwood, Crestview, Driggs, Eastwood, Morningside, Oakridge, Oakwood, Penn, Rosecrest, and Upland Terrace. However, boundary or feeder pattern adjustments to secondary schools could occur as a result of elementary changes.

Why is this area being studied?

Population analysis studies are conducted every year in areas where student population numbers have changed significantly. The study process is almost a full calendar year with many opportunities for community input before a decision is made to adjust school boundaries or close schools.

No final decisions about any boundary changes or school closures in this area will be made until December 2025.
