UTAH RIVERS COUNCIL'S RAINHARVEST PROGRAM RETURNS

MILLCREEK. Millcreek is once again partnering with the Utah Rivers Council and its RainHarvest program to bring our residents a limited number of heavily discounted American-made rain barrels. We are happy to be able to bring this successful initiative back to our residents.

RainHarvest distributes rain barrels to Utah residents to collect rainwater that falls on rooftops for later use on landscaping and gardens. This program offers residents the opportunity to affordably conserve water through rainwater collection. By purchasing these heavily discounted rain barrels, Utahns can reduce municipal water demand and improve the water quality of local streams, rivers, and lakes, by decreasing polluted runoff.

Why collect rainwater? Rainwater harvesting is legal in Utah, and with ongoing extreme drought conditions, there has never been a better time to start collecting your own water. Not only does rain harvesting reduce demand on municipal water systems, it also reduces the amount of pollution that enters the Great Salt Lake and local rivers from urban runoff during storm events.

How do I collect rainwater? During storm events, the rain that falls on rooftops flows through rain gutters and downspouts and can be collected by rain barrels. Made in the U.S. of 100% recycled plastic, not only are 50-gallon Ivy Rain Barrels an eco-conscious option for rainwater collecting, they are user-friendly and one of the most popular options for rainwater collecting across the country. They come with a locking lid, a mosquito screen, a 3/4" valve that can be connected to a garden hose and linking capability to connect multiple barrels

together.

When can I purchase a rain barrel? Starting on March 18 at 12pm, residents of Millcreek are invited to order these \$57 rain barrels at [RainWater Solutions website HERE](#) while supplies last. There are a limited number of \$57 barrels so place your order today! Once the subsidized barrels run out, \$85 rain barrels are available for purchase by any member of the public. The sale window will remain open until late April, 2025. The barrels will be distributed at a one-day, in-person, event in early-May. Rain barrels will not be shipped to residents.

Please note, purchasing a barrel is a two-step process. The first step is to enter your address into the URL below which will then be verified to ensure you are eligible for a subsidized barrel from Millcreek. Then you will be redirected to a page where you will receive a discount code. The second step is to enter this discount code into the purchasing website and finalize your barrel purchase. It is important to note that receiving a discount code is **not** confirmation of a purchase.

East-West Water Line Project

Salt Lake City Department of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) is constructing a new large diameter water line from the Terminal Storage Reservoir at approximately 3500 East along Metro Way to Grace Street at 3075 East.

CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

On **Friday, March 21, 2025**, construction crews will be milling Metro Way, from Valley Street to 3380 East. The roadway will be milled, a process of removing a layer of pavement, to prepare for the installation of the new East-West water line. The roadway will be in this condition until trench work begins early April 2025. Following milling, construction crews will be laying temporary asphalt on Margie Avenue and Grace Street.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Rough roadway surface
- Increased noise, vibrations, dust, and truck traffic
- Temporary on-street parking restrictions and driveway access interruptions
- Residents will be notified at least 48 hours in advance of any driveway access interruptions
- Temporary road closures, lane restrictions, and detours

Area 5 includes the following elementary schools, listed in alphabetical order: Cottonwood, Crestview, Driggs, Eastwood, Morningside, Oakridge, Oakwood, Penn, Rosecrest, and Upland Terrace. However, boundary or feeder pattern adjustments to secondary schools could occur as a result of elementary changes.

Population analysis studies are conducted every year in areas where student population numbers have changed significantly. The study process is almost a full calendar year with many opportunities for community input before a decision is made to adjust school boundaries or close schools.

Public Comment Policy and Procedure: The purpose of public comment is to allow citizens to address items on the agenda. Citizens requesting to address the Council may be asked to complete a written comment form and present it to the City Recorder. In general, the Chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action. *Public comment can be submitted via the City's website at:* <https://www.millcreekut.gov/FormCenter/Contact-Us-5/Public-Comments-61>.

Council members may participate from remote locations and may be connected to the electronic meeting by GoToMeeting, Zoom, or telephonic communications. The anchor location will be City Hall.
