A Message From Mayor Silvestrini About Due Process

TO THE RESIDENTS OF MILLCREEK:

I have been advised that three refugee families living lawfully and with proper documentation in Millcreek have received a letter this week from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security informing that their parole is being revoked within 7 days and directing them to leave the United States. By all appearances, this action has been taken without a hearing or affording these individuals any due process whatsoever, nor offering them an opportunity to appeal.

We certainly can hope that these letters were a mistake—a shocking and unacceptable one for sure. If they were not, they are an affront to constitutionally guaranteed rights to all persons in the United States to due process of law. *See U.S. Constitution, Amendment 5.* Our forebears fought a revolution to secure these rights, and we must all stand up when our government abridges them.

We have reached out to our Congressional delegation for assistance to investigate and, if appropriate, remedy this situation.

Millcreek is in no way a “sanctuary city” and we respect the right and duty of our federal government to enforce our immigration laws and even to deport violent criminals. But every person in the United States is entitled under the Constitution’s 5th Amendment to notice and a fair hearing before legal action can be taken against them. It does not appear that happened here.

We value our immigrant and refugee residents who have lawful status and we want them to feel safe in Millcreek. We will not stand by silently when the rights of people in our community are violated. When that happens, we will circle the wagons, speak out and defend the liberties we are guaranteed under the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Utah. That is the oath I took when I assumed my office as Mayor of Millcreek.

As Mayor of all Millcreek residents, I want you to know that I stand with you and will seek to assist you in ensuring your rights are respected.

Be water-wise—check the weather forecast using the National Weather Service website or your favorite local meteorologist, and only water when it's truly needed.

Help keep Millcreek beautiful and flood-free by clearing winter debris from storm drains near your home. Remember: *We All Live Downstream*. The City

sweeps streets once or twice a year, but your efforts go a long way in preventing flooding and keeping pollutants out of our waterways, which eventually flow into the Jordan River.

NUTRIENT POLLUTION AND LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

Nutrient pollution occurs from an excess of nitrogen and phosphorus in the environment and is a growing problem. This pollution impacts people's health, our environment, opportunities for recreation, and tourism.

Harvest your rain. Millcreek is partnering with the [Utah Rivers Council](#) offer residents the opportunity to affordably conserve water through rainwater collection. By purchasing heavily discounted rain collection barrels through URC's annual RainHarvest program, Utahns can heavily reduce municipal water demand and help improve the water quality of local streams, rivers and lakes by decreasing polluted runoff. 



The exhibit will be on display at the Millcreek Branch throughout the rest of April.



Upper Mill Creek Canyon Road Improvements Project



The Federal Highway Administration's Central Federal Lands Highway Division, in collaboration with Salt Lake County, Millcreek, and Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest, is currently working to improve the top 4.6 miles of Mill Creek Canyon Road beyond the Winter Gate.

This project aims to enhance safety, increase recreational access, and improve water quality affected by erosion and drainage issues.

Construction is anticipated to occur from spring to fall in 2025 and 2026, with the road reopening for winter recreation.



East-West Water Line Project April 2025 | Construction Notice

Salt Lake City Department of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) is constructing a new large diameter water line from the Terminal Storage Reservoir at approximately 3500 East along Metro Way to Grace Street at 3075 East.



Construction Notice

Starting as soon as **April 21, 2025**, Metro Way from Valley Street to 3380 East will be closed to through traffic to accommodate the installation of the new large diameter water line. Metro Way is anticipated to be reopened end of May 2025. **No parking is allowed on the roadway in the construction zone during this time.** Residents can expect an open trench on the south side of Metro Way. Local traffic will be shifted to the north side of the road. **For your safety, we encourage all residents to exercise caution when driving or walking in the area.**

Project Purpose

Phase 3 is a segment of the 6-mile water conveyance line that will provide an additional water supply to supplement existing wells in the Sugar House and Millcreek area as well as maintain SLCDPU's standard of reliability while meeting future growth water demands in the Salt Lake Valley.

What to Expect During Construction

- Construction activities will occur Monday through Friday during daylight hours
- Relocation of existing waterlines. Residents and businesses will be notified in advance of any water interruption.
- Increased noise, vibrations, dust, and truck traffic
- Temporary on-street parking restrictions and driveway access interruptions
- Residents will be notified 48 hours in advance of any driveway access interruptions
- Temporary road closures, lane restrictions, and detours are expected
- Bicyclists and pedestrians traveling through the area should follow all posted detour signs
- Any landscaping impacted by construction activities will be replaced to previous condition
