

The project has been years in the making, guided by a dream shared by the Millcreek City Council: to bring accessible, family-friendly outdoor recreation to this part of the city. Now, that dream has taken shape as a vibrant community space that connects people to the Jordan River and to neighboring cities.

“We all hope the Jordan River will someday be more of a shining star in our community,” said Millcreek Mayor Jeff Silvestrini. “It has so much potential, and efforts like this help us reach that potential.”

The new trailhead features a loop trail perfect for walking, jogging, or biking, along with a newly installed boat ramp that opens up the river for kayaking, canoeing, and other water adventures.

“We are happy to have a boat ramp in Millcreek now!” Mayor Silvestrini added. “It makes an awesome connection to our sister cities—we hope everyone enjoys it.”



This milestone was made possible through a strong partnership between Millcreek, Salt Lake County, the State of Utah Department of Natural

Resources, and the Jordan River Commission. Together, these partners have helped turn a shared vision into a vibrant new space for outdoor activity and community connection. Funding came from all of these partners, assembled by the city which itself contributed Community Development Block Grant funding and general fund dollars.

So, whether you're looking for a peaceful paddle, a refreshing bike ride, or just a new place to stretch your legs, the Millcreek Jordan River Trailhead is ready to welcome you. Grab your gear and go enjoy!

MILLCREEK. This is the **final week of the rain barrel sale** and the subsidized barrels are going fast. Millcreek residents can order a subsidized rain barrel at [RainWater Solutions website](https://www.rainwatersolutions.com) while supplies last. There are a limited number of \$57 barrels, so place your order today.

Once the subsidized barrels run out, \$85 rain barrels are available for purchase by any member of the public. The sale window will remain open until late April, 2025.

The barrels will be distributed at a one-day, in-person, event on May 10th. **Rain barrels will not be shipped** to residents.

Please note, purchasing a barrel is a two-step process. The first step is to click [HERE](#) and enter your address, which will then be verified to ensure you are eligible for a subsidized barrel from Millcreek. Then you will be redirected to a page where you will receive a discount code. The second step is to enter this discount code into the purchasing website and finalize your barrel purchase. It is important to note that receiving a discount code is **not** confirmation of a purchase. Place your order today for the sizeable discount.
