The CERT Basic Course is taught twice a year in Millcreek by a trained team of first responders and skilled volunteers who have completed a CERT Train-the-Trainer course conducted by Utah's state training office for emergency management.

The CERT Basic Course covers training in:

- Disaster preparedness
- Disaster response organization
- Basic disaster medical operations
- Light fire suppression
- Light search and rescue operations
- Disaster Psychology

This spring's program concluded with a comprehensive disaster simulation exercise conducted in collaboration with our neighboring cities of South Salt Lake and Holladay. This joint exercise reinforced the value of regional cooperation in emergency response and preparedness.

CERT training is a key component in building a resilient and prepared community. We encourage residents interested in making a meaningful impact to consider participating in our next CERT training, scheduled for Fall 2025. Watch future issues of this newsletter for information on dates and times.

[U.S. Census Bureau Estimates for Cities and Housing Units, 2024](#)

This week, the Census Bureau released new population estimates for Utah's cities during the year 2024. Millcreek's population is now at **64,217** in the latest report [HERE](#) (and [HERE](#) is a KSL report summarizing some of it). A few interesting observations:

- Millcreek is now the 12th largest city in Utah.
- We're the 6th largest city in Salt Lake County.
- We grew by **1,316** residents in 2024 (14th largest increase in the state), which is a 2.1% increase.

Our growth is especially remarkable because we are a “built-out” city and yet we still grew way more than some of our neighbors (South Salt Lake +159, Taylorsville +61, West Valley City +552). Some of our peer cities are even *shrinking* in population (Holladay -53, Cottonwood Heights -131, Sandy -189).

We added more residents last year than South Jordan (+729) and West Jordan (+491) COMBINED! We grew as much as Riverton (+1,323) did last year, and almost as much as Herriman (+1,668). This shows that we need to keep fighting for this corner of the valley's share of transportation and other dollars.

Our city is doing its part to add to Utah's desperately needed housing stock, aided by our relatively lean team that plans, permits, and ensures the additional public works necessary to our growth.

- Perform safety checks that protect your home from emergencies before fire, flood or disaster strike.
- Support economic development by making our buildings sturdier, and therefore longer lasting.
- Play a significant role in community planning decision making as a connection between government, business and built environment partners.
