### **Governor Cox Lauds Millcreek for Housing Efforts**

MILLCREEK. On Thursday of this week, Governor Spencer Cox held a housing summit at Utah's Governor's Mansion with more than 45 mayors and local government officials. Mayor Jeff Silvestrini and City Manager Mike Winder represented Millcreek as the officials gathered to discuss strategies for the years'-long need across the state to increase the number of affordable

starter homes in our communities.

The summit's goal was ambitious: to conceptualize the construction of 35,000 new dwellings designed to fulfill the needs of Utah families entering the housing market.

During the summit, Millcreek was able to showcase its efforts, having issued building permits for more than 2,000 new housing units since 2018. Governor Cox specifically called out cities that have been exceptional at creating places where higher density housing is working—he noted Millcreek Common as an example where the state has been able to provide grant funding for outdoor recreation that complements the construction of new residential buildings around the Common.

In a press conference after the summit, Governor Cox publicly acknowledged Mayor Silvestrini as an elected official who is working to be part of the solution and who shares best practices with other communities.


The vision of Millcreek's leaders has been to channel new growth and density along major street corridors and in town centers like Millcreek Common and the area of western Millcreek near TRAX stations while continuing to preserve single family neighborhoods.

“We have to keep adding new housing of all types so that our children can move out of our basements and into homes of their own,” said Governor Cox. “In Millcreek, we are working hard to find creative ways to do our part,” acknowledged Mayor Silvestrini. “It is heartening that the state recognizes this, and has also benefitted us with increased grants, road funding, and sales tax distribution,” he said.



# A CITY DOING HOUSING RIGHT

## MILLCREEK IS GROWING

As of May 15, 2024, the U.S. Census Bureau estimates Millcreek's population to be 64,217, a 2.1 percent increase from the year prior. Although Millcreek is a built-out city, our growth was the 14th largest among Utah's cities, according to *U.S. Census Bureau Estimates for Cities and Housing Units, 2024*, a report published by the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute. **We added more residents last year than South Jordan and West Jordan combined.**

This growth is not surprising. Since 2018, Millcreek has issued building permits for over 2,000 new housing units, and has entitled nearly 1,225 additional multifamily or townhome units, totaling over 3,200 units. As these permits turn into new housing units, Millcreek will continue to grow.

## MILLCREEK IS BUILDING

Millcreek is growing because it is building. Of the more than 2,000 units Millcreek permitted since 2018, 75 percent are in multifamily or mixed use projects that are located within a half mile of the Meadowbrook TRAX station or in Millcreek's City Center, on 3300 South between 1300 East and Highland Drive. Looking forward, Millcreek hopes to continue growing its city center, and is working with partners to incorporate permanently-affordable owner-occupied housing in the City Center.

Millcreek is also promoting housing development in the other centers identified in the Wasatch Choice 2050 Vision, including at a new town center on Wasatch Boulevard.

Additional growth is occurring along our corridors, particularly along transit lines. Millcreek recently revamped its entire zoning ordinance to ease regulations for ADUs, reduce parking requirements, encourage infill development, and provide incentives for affordable housing. **Millcreek undertook these actions without state mandates or preemption.**

# MILLCREEK IS COMMITTED TO PROMOTING AFFORDABLE HOUSING



In 2023, Millcreek adopted a new Moderate Income Housing Plan that included several affordable housing strategies identified in state statute. Millcreek immediately began implementing these strategies, which are summarized below.

STRATEGY	STATUS	SUCCESS STORIES
----------	--------	-----------------

➤ **Rezone for densities suitable for moderate income housing.**

Since 2023, Millcreek rezoned several properties, entitling an additional 51 units along corridors and in established commercial and mixed use areas. As part of rezones, deed restrictions applied to 28 units to ensure owner occupancy.



*The Howick is being developed by the Community Development Corporation of Utah (CDCU), and will provide 150 dwellings affordable to households earning 60% of the County's area median income. Millcreek partnered with CDCU to use CRA funds to offset building permit fees and impact fees.*

➤ **Reduce regulations for ADUs.**

In 2025, Millcreek streamlined its ADU ordinances to reduce parking requirements to 1 per ADU, and eliminating separate setback and lot coverage requirements. Now ADUs are treated like any accessory building.

➤ **Zone for higher density or affordable housing near TODs, commercial centers, or employment centers, and in commercial or mixed use zones.**

Affordable Housing is now permitted in all commercial and mixed use zones. Qualifying affordable housing developments in commercial and mixed use zones are not subject to commercial use requirements.

➤ **Reduce parking requirements.**

In 2023, Millcreek reduced parking requirements for affordable housing and for any mixed use or multifamily development in TOD areas.



*The Morrissey is also being developed by CDCU. This project will provide 64 dwellings affordable to households earning 25% - 55% of the County's area median income. This project is awaiting receipt of tax credits. Meanwhile, Millcreek partnered with CDCU and Salt Lake County to acquire funds to complete a sidewalk connection along West Temple to this project, so that it will be more competitive in the next round of tax credit funding.*

➤ **Reduce regulations for multifamily development that is compatible with single-family residential dwellings.**

As of 2025, conditional use permits are no longer required for multifamily developments under 25 units and below 35' in height. In the RM zone, lot sizes can be as low as 1,500 square feet.

Our R-4 zone included new design standards to encourage missing middle housing that is compatible with single-family housing.

➤ **Implement affordable housing incentives.**

Millcreek's code now includes height and density bonuses, parking and open space reductions, and waivers of commercial use requirements and development fees for qualifying affordable housing developments.

➤ **Reduce impact fees for moderate income housing.**

In 2023, Millcreek partnered with CDCU to offset and reduce building permit fees for their deeply affordable housing project, the Howick.



*Millcreek recently approved a rezone to accommodate multifamily development adjacent to single-family homes. As a condition of the development approval, Millcreek worked with the developer on a design that accommodated six units in two buildings, built to look like single-family homes. These projects will be platted as owner-occupied condominiums, which will bring naturally affordable owner-occupied housing to Millcreek, without requiring any city incentives.*

➤ **Partner with an entity to promote construction of moderate income housing.**

Millcreek is currently exploring partnerships with Salt Lake County and other developers to utilize CRA funds to offset development costs to allow projects to qualify as affordable owner-occupied projects.

Millcreek may acquire land in its City Center for use as affordable housing.



## Hot Weather Do's & Don't to Keep Your Dog Safe An Important Message From Salt Lake County Animal Services

Ensure you're the ultimate pet owner and prioritize your pup's comfort this summer! You and your furry friend deserve to stay chill and safe, steering clear of scorching cars, sizzling pavement, and sweltering balconies or patios.

**Hot Cars:** Don't underestimate the danger. Once the mercury hits 70 degrees, car interiors can soar past 116 degrees in just 10 minutes. Even on a mild 75-degree day, cracking a window or seeking shade won't save your pet from the lethal heat inside. Heatstroke, brain damage, and worse can result. If you spot a distressed pet in a vehicle—panting excessively, not responsive, drooling, or lethargic—act fast. Dial Salt Lake County Animal Service's Animal Dispatch at 801-840-4000. Avoid breaking windows yourself; instead, document the situation by taking down the license plate, taking a photo of the pet and providing details to Animal Control Officers.

**Hot Pavement:** Protect those precious paws. Summer sidewalks can scorch, causing painful burns. Before stepping out, test the pavement with the back of your hand. If you can't endure the heat for five seconds, it's too hot for your pup. Plan to walk your dog during cooler morning or evening hours and skip outings to crowded events like festivals or markets.

**Hot Balconies:** Even shaded balconies can become danger zones. High temperatures can quickly make them unbearable for pets left unattended. Anxious and dehydrated, they may attempt risky escapes. If you witness a distressed pet on a balcony, reach out to Animal Control at 801-840-4000 immediately.



# Highland Drive Closure at 1300 E



*Although this is a Salt Lake City project, it borders Millcreek and this road is used by many of our residents. This **closure of Highland Drive** will impact many Millcreek residents. Avoid the area if possible and drive carefully in construction zones. See the message below from Salt Lake City regarding their 1300 E project.*

**Closure Alert:** Highland Drive at 1300 East Starting as early as Monday, June 2, crews will close Highland Drive at 1300 East for six weeks. This closure will help accelerate the work in the area to stay track for project completion by fall 2025. Drivers and nearby residents can expect increased noise, dust, vibrations, and traffic delays.

This closure will help accelerate the work in the area to stay on track for project completion by **fall 2025**.

## What to Expect:

- No right turns from southbound 1300 East onto northbound Highland Drive.
- No through traffic on northbound Highland Drive through the intersection at 1300 East.
- No designated right turns from northbound Highland Drive onto 1300 East, although free right turns will be allowed at the intersection.
- Traffic reduced to one lane on northbound 1300 East at the intersection at Highland Drive.

- One lane in each direction on Highland Drive between 2700 South and 1300 East.
- Increased noise, dust, and vibration.
- Traffic delays



## **Siggard Drive; 1720 E to Orchard Dr Stormwater Utility Fee Project**

MILLCREEK. In response to community concerns about flooding, Millcreek will be implementing a new storm drain system along Siggard Avenue. This system will extend from 1720 East to Orchard Drive. The goal of this initiative is to manage excess rainfall, reduce water accumulation on roadways, and prevent flooding in homes. Construction crews are expected to begin work on Siggard Avenue as early as Monday, June 2, and continue through August 2025.

### *What to Expect:*

- Construction activities will take place Mon – Fri (7 a.m. – 10 p.m.)
- Intermittent road closures and traffic shifts
