## Millcreek Requires Solicitation Permits

MILLCREEK. To protect your safety and privacy, all door-to-door solicitors in Millcreek must be registered with the city and display a Millcreek-issued photo ID badge (Millcreek Code 5.17.090). This badge will show their name, photo, and the business or organization they represent.

Soliciting is only allowed between 9:00 AM and 9:00 PM (Millcreek Code 5.17.160). Solicitors must also respect any clearly posted “No Soliciting” signs (Millcreek Code 5.17.140).

If someone comes to your door, ask to see their ID. If they don't have it, are rude, refuse to leave, or ignore a “No Soliciting” sign, call Unified Police at [801-840-4000](tel:801-840-4000). Solicitors are required by law to leave immediately when asked (Millcreek Code 5.17.150).

Aggressive or inappropriate behavior by solicitors is a violation of Millcreek Code (5.17.130, 5.17.150) and may result in fines or other enforcement actions (Millcreek Code 5.17.190).

## Salt Lake County Animal Services Lobby Renovation Underway

Construction is officially underway on a major renovation of our front lobby at Salt Lake County Animal Services. This exciting project reflects our continued commitment to creating a more welcoming and functional space for the public, adopters, and volunteers.

Among the key improvements is a newly designed Adoption Suite located near the front entrance. Our Adoption Team will be relocated from the auditorium to this bright and accessible space, making the adoption process easier and more inviting for our visitors.

Other updates include the conversion of the women's restroom into two private family restrooms, a new windowed station to improve lobby visibility and safety for our on-site officer, and a renovated Volunteer Suite with improved organization and workspace to better support our volunteers.



## CONSTRUCTION UPDATES



## Neffs Canyon Geotechnical Investigation

MILLCREEK. In coordination with the U.S. Forest Service, Millcreek will be conducting a geotechnical investigation as part of the environmental process for the proposed debris basin in Neff's Canyon. Crews expect to begin investigative activities as early as Monday, June 23, and continue through the end of June. Investigative activities include:

- Large drilling equipment will be on-site to collect soil samples.
- Small excavation will occur to create and backfill several test pits.
- Removal of small plants and brush to ensure access to equipment and minimal impact to surrounding environment.

### What to Expect

- Investigation activities take place between 7 a.m. – 5 p.m.
- Drilling and excavation equipment in the area
- Limited access to Neffs Canyon Loop trail (Review map above)
- Main trail access into Neffs Canyon will remain open
- Residents in the area may experience increased noise during these activities

\*Project schedule is subject to change due to material, weather, and delay.

**Project Information.** Neffs Creek is located on an active alluvial fan, a fan-shaped area formed by stream and debris flow deposits. These areas are subject to sudden and unpredictable flooding, which has increased over time due to development, erosion, severe storms, and wildfire damage. The investigative activities will help assess the feasibility and environmental impacts of constructing a debris basin to reduce flood and debris flow risk to the Mount

Olympus community.

## **Sunnydale Safety Improvement Project**

MILLCREEK. Construction on the west side of Sunnydale Drive, between Upland Drive and Oakridge Drive, starts Monday, June 23. This project is part of a safety improvement initiative designed to enhance pedestrian access and safety. Improvements will include upgrades to the sidewalk and the installation of a pedestrian access ramp near the crosswalk. We anticipate that the project will continue through the end of July.
