

## TOMORROW, Fri July 4th Look Up at 9:09AM

MILLCREEK. While you are enjoying the breakfast, parade and midway games with friends and family at the East Mill Creek Lions Club Parade and Carnival, remember to **look to the skies** at around 9:09am to watch (and hear) the F-35A Lightning II Flyover. This event is courtesy of the the Hill Air Force Base 419TH FW and its "Citizen Airmen", a group who serve part time in the military but are full-time members of their local community.

Leading the flyover formation this year will be Lt. Col. Justin Cleveland. Alongside him are Maj. Daniel Huber, Maj. Justin Newman and Maj. Dustin Smail—together they bring more than 8,000 combined hours in military aviation experience.

419th FW members regularly volunteer to deploy in support of contingency operations and humanitarian efforts around the world. The 419th FW offers a diverse range of combat capabilities, as well as full-spectrum mission support such as civil engineering, security forces, medical, aerial port, firefighting, supply and transportation. The 419th FW was the first Air Force Reserve unit to fly the F-35A Lightning II alongside the active-duty 3889th FW at Hill AFB.

We would like to thank the men and women of Hill Air Force Base and the 419th Fighter Wing for their support of Millcreek's own East Mill Creek Lions Club 4th of July celebration.





## CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction Holiday

MILLCREEK. All construction activities in Millcreek will be on pause in observance of the Independence Day holiday and will resume on Monday, July 7th. Traffic control devices will remain in place to protect the work zones.



## Milling Notice

On **Monday, July 7th**, crews will be milling Grace Street from Metropolitan Way to Margie Avenue. The roadway will be milled, a process of removing a layer of pavement, to prepare for new pavement. Residents can expect increased noise during this time.

## Paving Notice

On **July 10th, 11th, and 14th**, Margie Avenue from Grace Street to Metro Way, Metro Way from Valley Street to 3380 East, and Grace Street from Metropolitan Way to Margie Avenue will be closed while crews pave the roadway. On **Tuesday, July 15th**, the intersection of Valley Street and Metro Way will be fully closed to accommodate paving operations.

Roadways will be open and access to driveways will be maintained over the weekend of July 12th and 13th. **On-street parking will not be allowed from July 10th to July 15th.**

## Sod Replacement

Landscape restoration will occur early July. If you receive new sod during landscape restoration, please consider the following new sod care information:

- Water the new sod 2 to 3 times daily for two weeks.
- Avoid overwatering — if you notice pooling, sogginess, or run-off, decrease the amount or frequency of watering.

During this time, cars will not be able to drive or park on the road. Please plan to park vehicles on neighboring streets (valley Street, Metropolitan Way, Grace Street, Marie Avenue) if you need access to your vehicles during paving operations.

- Wait at least two weeks before mowing the new sod.

Please note that residents are responsible to care for the new sod after it has been installed.
