many of us remember, dumpsters have been delivered to our neighborhoods so we can get rid of our accumulated junk. The dumpsters are placed along the streets in our neighborhoods, left for a day so residents can fill them, and then removed, emptied, and placed in other locations throughout the city.

This year, the dumpsters will be delivered **April 15 through May 9**. You should be getting a postcard in the next couple of weeks giving you the exact date a dumpster will be delivered to your specific neighborhood. Also, at the end of March, you'll be able to [click here](#) and provide your address to determine the exact date you'll be able to rid yourself of your junk.

Millcreek is a part of the Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District (WFWRD), as are Holladay, Murray, Cottonwood Heights, and a dozen other areas of the Salt Lake Valley. For many years, the dumpsters were delivered on roughly the same day to each neighborhood throughout the valley. That meant some of us always had to do our cleanup each year during a holiday week -- many Millcreek residents consistently had to haul their trash during the July 4th or 24th weeks. To be fair to all residents, WFWRD now rotates the dropoff dates.





Open House to Collect Comments on Big and Little Cottonwood Canyons Transportation Plans

SALT LAKE COUNTY. UDOT recently revised the study approach of the Little Cottonwood Canyon Environmental Impact Statement (LCC EIS) to focus on the immediate needs of avalanche mitigation, trailhead parking and Wasatch Boulevard.

UDOT will also continue to examine solutions for additional needs in both Little and Big Cottonwood Canyons through the Cottonwood Canyons Transportation Action Plan (TAP), in partnership with the Central Wasatch Commission (CWC).

The EIS purpose and need, initial alternatives and initial screening criteria will be available for review and comment.

The open house will also provide an opportunity to learn more about the Cottonwood Canyons TAP, including past efforts that inform the process, the role of UDOT and CWC with the Cottonwoods TAP and also provide comments to the study team.

A Message from Animal Services

MILLCREEK. Millcreek contracts with Salt Lake County to provide animal services to our city. Along with Millcreek, they also serve the Metro Townships, Bluffdale, Herriman, Holladay, Midvale, and Salt Lake City. Animal Services has asked us to deliver this message:

Don't be a Nuisance!

Spring is coming and it's time for you and your pup to get outside and exercise in the neighborhood, the parks, and on the trails. But before you bound out of the house be sure to grab a leash and those poop bags.

Leash Laws

Many violators of [leash laws] will claim that their pet is friendly, or less aggressive when on leash. But Animal Services would remind you that not everyone likes a "friendly" off-leash dog, nor do other dogs that are on leash. A leash is not an optional accessory, it's the LAW to wear one. If you and your dog are caught off-

leash and it's not a designated off-leash dog area, you WILL get a ticket and you will pay a fine.

Pack Out the Poo

It's the law to clean up after your dog. If you get caught not picking up their poop, expect to pay a fine. This is a public nuisance violation. Be a considerate neighbor or hiker and carry poop bags to clean-up after your dog when out on an adventure, whether it's in the neighborhood or on a hiking trail, you must pick it up and dispose of it properly.
