Focus for Donations to the Willow Glen Apartment Fire Victims Has Changed

MILLCREEK – We have been overwhelmed with the generosity of Millcreek residents as well as others from all over the valley in response to the catastrophic Willow Glen apartment fire.

The Willow Glen Apartments are a complex of four buildings with 12 units in each building. The fire broke out around 1:30pm on Friday in a vacant lot next to the apartment complex and due to high heat and winds, spread quickly to two buildings in the apartment complex. Two additional buildings were evacuated for safety but were not damaged, The two impacted buildings were condemned, are complete losses, and residents were not allowed to re-enter to search

for belongings. Both buildings will have to be demolished.

The families who lived in those two buildings lost everything - some even lost their cars and precious pets. They are in the beginning phases of recovery and have so much to think about. New housing, replacing important documents, clothing, anything you can think of. There was no time to gather anything, the fire was so fast and hot.

As early as two hours after the fire was first reported, donations began pouring in at the evacuation center that had been immediately set up in an LDS ward near the apartment building. We can't thank the members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, the members of that ward, the Red Cross and everyone who had a hand in getting the evacuation center up and running so quickly enough. People showed up with food and water first and then all sorts of donations began flowing in. The generosity, care, and compassion of everyone was heartwarming and so very helpful.

Over the weekend as the evacuation center location began to be wrapped up, city hall became the location for donation drops,.

As you can see from the photo above, the generosity of our community has been truly amazing and frankly, overwhelming. We are sorting through items and fire victims are beginning to come in to pick up what they need but at this time we need to **pause physical donations, no additional donations will be accepted.** As these families are sorting their lives out, finances are taking center stage,

New apartments need to be found and rented with the required deposit and first and last month's rent, new vehicles need to be purchased, new clothes to wear to work, and the list for needs goes on and on. **Right now, what the displaced residents need is financial assistance!**

The city has established a link where donations can be made - bit.ly/millcreekfirehelp. Funds donated will be sent to the residents of the 23 units (the 24th unit was vacant) whose apartments were destroyed. The city council will be discussing this at their council meeting this evening and we expect that city funds will also be available for distribution,. The agenda for tonight's meeting appears below. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
