



You will not receive a ballot in the mail or be eligible to vote unless you live in either District 2 or District 4 and have timely registered to vote. Click on the map above to determine your council district. You can check your registration status [HERE](#). The last day to register to vote in the November 4th election is October 24th.

Ballots will be mailed by the Salt Lake County Clerk to registered eligible voters on October 14th. **NOTE THAT state law changed this year so that ballots must be RECEIVED by the clerk on or before November 4th to be counted.**

There are several ways to make sure that your vote is timely:

- Put your completed ballot in the mail in time for it to be delivered to the clerk on or before November 4th. (The postmark on a ballot is no longer the determining date for your ballot to count).
- Vote in person early or drop off your completed ballot at the Salt Lake County Government Center, 2001 S State Street, Salt Lake City, Room S1-120, on Monday through Friday from October 21 to October 31.
- Deposit your ballot in any ballot drop-box (open 24/7) located within Salt Lake County. Drop boxes are available to you from the time you receive your mailed ballot until 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Click [HERE](#) to find a convenient drop box within the County. Note that there is a drop box at the north end of Millcreek Common, 1354 E Chambers Ave, between City Hall and the Granite Credit Union Adventure Hub.
- Vote in person or drop off your ballot on Election Day between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. at any vote center located within the County. Check the County's website [HERE](#) to find an election day vote center that is convenient to you. Note that valid identification will be required.

The goals in the 2025 Water Conservation Plan are to:

- Facilitate efforts to increase resource and system resilience in the face of identified risks, including climate change
- Encourage the continued wise use of water, an important limited resource, and
- Be consistent with conservation goals established by the State, Central Utah Project, Alliance for Water Efficiency, and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.




