Millcreek Partners With "A Bolder Way Forward for Utah"

MILLCREEK. Earlier this week, the City Council unanimously passed a resolution to support Utah State University's Utah Women & Leadership Project, A Bolder Way Forward for Utah.

The project's overarching goal is to ensure that more girls, women, and their families thrive throughout Utah.

According to the [A Bolder Way Forward website](#),

"National and statewide studies continue to show that women and girls in Utah are not thriving in critical areas.



"Year after year, Utah continues to have high levels of domestic violence, sexual assault, child sexual abuse, and gender-based discrimination, while also ranking as the worst state for women's equality and having low levels of women's

leadership representation in nearly all domains, including politics and business. Although the needle has moved slightly in a few areas, with its current trajectory it will take three or four decades to make notable progress."

A Bolder Way Forward for Utah, a project led by Utah State University's John M. Huntsman School of Business, collects state and national data on various critical issues that affect women, and "disseminat[es] academic research for the purpose of driving effective society change." [Utah Women & Leadership Project \(UWLP\), Mission-History](#).

Almost 70 research and policy briefs dating back more than 15 years discuss "a host of topics that impact Utah girls and women, those who influence them, and those who are influenced by them. Most compare Utah with national statistics so residents and leaders can see what changes need to be made." UWLP, Utah State University. Click [HERE](#) for links to the briefs.

For example, one recently updated brief explains how women are faring in business: "Utah was ranked 45th among states, with 15.8% of businesses being female-owned." [The Status of Women and Entrepreneurship in Utah: A 2025 Update](#), UWLP, Jon M. Huntsman School of Business, Utah State University (August 2025).

"Moreover," the study goes on to note, "Utah women-owned businesses are dramatically underrepresented in the most lucrative fields, including construction, where men own 8.5 times as many businesses as women, and in Professional, Scientific, and Technical services, where men own 5.5 times as many businesses as women." To address some of the issues it has identified, the organization offers [curriculum](#) "designed to teach skills, expert insights, and interactive learning to help participants build confidence, navigate challenges, and drive positive societal change." It also has what it calls "[toolkits](#)", each of which collects resources on topics (e.g., body image, childcare, family life, poverty, STEM, etc). "relating to strengthening the impact of Utah girls and women."

The City Council appreciates the opportunity to join as a partner with other cities, towns, and counties across Utah in a collective effort to magnify and advance the UWLP's work.


