in Wildland Urban Interface Areas**

## in Millcreek Likely to be Affected by Proposed New State Law



MILLCREEK. A number of homes in the Olympus Cove and Grandeur Peak neighborhoods are located in the Wildland Urban Interface (WUI), which is the area where homes and development meet or intermingle with wildland vegetation.

Because these areas face higher wildfire exposure, they require extra precautions—such as defensible space, ignition-resistant construction, and vegetation management.

Millcreek is required by state statute to adopt a City wildland interface map wherein new construction and remodels must follow the 2006 Utah Wildland Urban Interface Code. The City map regulates how the building code is applied. The State of Utah also has a map that identifies high-risk WUI areas. You can see if your



property will likely be included in the State's high-risk WUI map by [clicking here](#) (look for the high-risk areas).

The Utah Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands will be hosting one of three statewide public meetings regarding House Bill 48, which focuses on Wildland

Urban Interface mapping, high-risk area designations, and wildfire mitigation planning.

**This will be the only meeting held in Salt Lake County**, and provides a valuable opportunity for city staff, planners, elected officials, and the general public to learn more about how HB48 may impact local communities and their wildfire preparedness planning efforts.




