Preliminary Design of 39th So. Improvements Begins

MILLCREEK. The process to implement improvements along 3900 South from 2300 East to I-215 has begun. A consultant team has been selected to complete the initial phase-preliminary design and environmental clearance.

Construction is currently planned for 2020.

The designers' goal is to create a safe and aesthetically pleasing street that is accommodating for all motorists and pedestrians. We anticipate the project will include continuous sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drains, improved pedestrian crossings, dedicated bike lanes and enhanced UTA bus stops.

The project leverages \$8.7 million in grants obtained from Salt Lake County and the federal government as a result of Mayor Silvestrini's work with the

Wasatch Front Regional Council and the Salt Lake County Council.

The environmental clearance, as required by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), will begin in mid-March and will continue through June 2019. You may see orange-vested land surveyors on the street, and an occasional drone flying over the roadway in order to map the 3900 South corridor. This is all part of the process needed to complete the project.

Open houses and city council meetings will be scheduled this spring in Millcreek and in Holladay to introduce the project, to answer any questions and receive public comment from residents, business owners and the general public.

FREE SANDBAGS AVAILABLE

MILLCREEK. With extended rain in the forecast and potential strong runoff in the next month or so, we are encouraging residents to prepare in advance.

Millcreek does not expect generalized flooding but residents who are concerned about localized flooding on their property may pick up free sandbags at the Salt Lake County Public Works Yard located at 604 W 6960 S in Midvale.

Residents are allowed up to 25 bags, which can be picked up anytime during regular business hours from 8 to 5 or after hours by calling ahead to 385-468-6101 to make arrangements.

If you have concerns or have had problems in the past, be prepared by having some sandbags at the ready. Please report serious flooding issues to Millcreek during business hours at 801-214-2700 or after hours at 385-468-6101.



Green Waste Collection Begins this Week

MILLCREEK. If you have already been out in your garden raking up yard debris and have filled your green can, our partners at Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling would like to let you know that green can collection has begun.

Yard debris is not the only waste you can put in the green can. You can also toss in your organic household items, like egg shells, coffee grounds, tea bags, and fruit and vegetable scraps.

According to the WFWRD, here are some of the advantages to using the green can:

- A green waste can is less expensive than an additional garbage can. (Annual fees for Green Waste can = \$114 vs. Annual fees for additional waste can = \$204.)
- Green waste is less expensive to process, keeping costs low.
- Reduce the amount of waste sent to the landfill as garbage.
- Green waste is processed into usable organic compost.
- Reduce greenhouse emissions caused by decomposing organic landfill waste.


Property owners and residents are encouraged to attend to learn about the minor property acquisitions needed for this project.


REMINDER ABOUT PARKING WARNING NOTICES
