Councilmember Cheri Jackson Unanimously Selected to Complete Mayor Silvestrini's Term

MILLCREEK. Earlier this week, the Millcreek City Council unanimously selected their colleague, City Councilmember Cheri Jackson, to complete the remaining two years of retiring Mayor Jeff Silvestrini's term. As an applicant for the position, Councilmember Jackson was excluded from voting on the selection.

In the special Millcreek City Council meeting, five candidates were publicly interviewed for the position: M. Jamie Walker, M. Gardner Reid, Jacob Richardson, Curtis A. Larsen and Councilmember Jackson.

In a ringing endorsement of the new Mayor-elect, Mayor Silvestrini said, "I've had nine years of experience working with Cheri Jackson, and I know she has always been engaged and active not only as a councilmember for her district, but for the whole city. I have full confidence that Cheri is the best candidate to preserve the culture in City Hall to serve well the public, but also to continue to execute on the vision that we have outlined since incorporation."

Mayor Silvestrini will continue to serve in his capacity as mayor until Mayor-elect Jackson takes the oath of office and is sworn in at the City Council meeting on Monday, November 10.

"Serving Millcreek has been an extraordinary honor," Mayor-elect Jackson said. "I look forward to continuing this work as your new mayor – ensuring our city remains a thriving, welcoming, and resilient community."

Mayor-elect Jackson was born and raised in Millcreek, graduated from Skyline High School, earned a Bachelor of Science in Psychology from Brigham Young University, and later completed a Master of Public Administration from Utah Valley University. After her husband, Romm, completed his military service, they chose to return home to Millcreek in 1995, where they raised their four sons on the same street where her parents lived. The Jackson family has now expanded to include three daughters-in-law and three grandchildren.

As a city councilwoman since the time Millcreek was incorporated, she has served in various positions at various times, including as Millcreek's representative on both the Unified Fire Authority and Unified Fire Service Area Boards and as City Treasurer. She also worked with the Millcreek Emergency Resiliency Committee, Utah 100 Communities Renewal Energy Design Committee, Millcreek Promise Executive Committee, Millcreek Miracle Business Committee and as the liaison for the Millcreek Youth Council.

Unofficial Election Results for Districts 2 and 4

MILLCREEK. Millcreek voters have apparently chosen Thom DeSirant to serve another term as the representative for Council District 2 and Bev Uipi to

continue her role as the representative for Council District 4. With 96% of the Millcreek votes counted (6,662 out of 6,916 cast throughout the city), it is unlikely that results will change when the official results are made available after the canvass to be held on November 18th.

We extend our thanks to Angie Gray and Connor Jett Gale for their candidacies for these seats and their willingness to serve our city. We look forward to continued dialogue with them on important city issues.

City Council District 2 - Thom DeSirant

Thom DeSirant, who has served one term as Council District 2's representative, expressed gratitude for the opportunity to continue serving. "I appreciate the voters' trust in me, and I'm excited to keep working for our city."



City Council District 4 - Bev Uipi



Bev Uipi will continue to represent Council District 4, a role she has held since the city's incorporation. "As the first Pacific Islander woman elected to public office in Utah, I feel I've brought a powerful voice for every family and a proven ability to turn collaboration into progress."

City Council District 3 - To Be Determined

Upon taking the oath of office as Mayor, Cheri Jackson will give up her current role as City Councilmember representing Millcreek Council District 3. To fill the seat for the remaining two years of her term, Utah law requires the Council to go through the same process that led to her own selection to fill the vacancy created by Mayor Silvestrini's retirement.



In general, the Chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
