MILLCREEK. On November 10, Cheri Jackson was officially sworn in as the new mayor of Millcreek.

MILLCREEK. Upon becoming Millcreek Mayor, the City Council District 3 seat Mayor Jackson previously held became vacant will need to filled for the remaining two years of her term. As required by Utah law, the council will go through the same process that led to her selection to fill the mayoral vacancy.

Council District 3 applications were posted on the [Millcreek website](#) on Friday, November 7th, with links posted in the November 7th issue of this newsletter. Interested residents of Council District 3 have until close of business today, **Friday, November 14th**, to file an application.

From its beginnings in 1925, when Lucille Young Reid served as the first president of the newly formed Utah Congress of Parents and Teachers, the organization has united parents, educators, and community members in a shared mission-to make every child's potential a reality.


Throughout its history, the Utah PTA has led efforts to strengthen public education and support families. Its accomplishments include advancing full-day kindergarten, promoting child-labor protections and public-health initiatives, improving school lunch programs, ensuring stable education funding, and advocating for safer schools and stronger family engagement.

Founded in 1897 as the National Congress of Mothers, the Parent Teacher Association has evolved into a powerful national voice for children. Its founders-Phoebe Apperson Hearst, Alice McLellan Birney, and Selena Sloan Butler-were visionary leaders whose commitment to children and families continues to guide PTA's work today.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Stormwater Utility Fee (SUF) Projects Reach Completion

MILLCREEK. We are making progress in utilizing our Stormwater Utility Fee (SUF) through the introduction of two new storm drain systems in our community.

In June, we kicked off the construction season with the Orchard Drive SUF project, which involved installing a brand-new storm drain system to address significant flooding concerns raised by residents. Although we aimed to complete the project before the start of school at William Penn Elementary, the construction crew encountered multiple challenges due to the project's depth, location, and third-party utilities, which complicated the installation of the 15-inch pipes.

Our second project began in September on Astro Way, in Olympus Cove, focusing on improving failing infrastructure and connecting to the new system on Gilroy Road. The hilly terrain posed similar challenges, but our construction crew and stormwater team demonstrated excellent problem-solving skills and worked diligently to overcome these challenges. Despite the obstacles, crews were able to complete the project promptly, with minimal impact on residents' everyday commute.

Both projects are now focused on completing minor punch list items to ensure

compliance with Millcreek standards while cleanup and restoration efforts continue.

Looking ahead to next year, we expect to continue constructing major projects, such as Phase 2 of 2000 East and Parkview Drive. To learn more about our stormwater utility fee and capital improvement projects, visit the Millcreek website [HERE](#).

- FREE! Climbing Wall All Day - November 14 & 15 (first-come, first-served)






