### **Council to Select District 3 Representative**

MILLCREEK. Upon the swearing-in of Mayor Cheri Jackson, the City Council District 3 seat she previously held became vacant and must now be filled for the remaining two years of her term. As required by Utah law, the council will go through the same process used to select Mayor Jackson to fill the mayoral vacancy.



## American Institute of Architects Award Millcreek Common

Millcreek Common continues to win awards, this time being recognized with the 2025 Architecture Award of Merit from the Utah chapter of the American Institute of Architects. "The project overall is commendable for its site plan and landscape architecture," said the jury.

"Highly versatile community outdoor space, with intentional material use recalling history of the site. The project succeeds at both the small and large scales simultaneously, creating a place rather than a space. Straightforward ingredients are combined with discipline, creating a powerful urban node."

In addition to the Award of Merit, Millcreek Common received an additional acknowledgement with a Community Impact Citation. "The jury noted that in many respects, the project is great due to the greatness of the owner's program," they said of Millcreek's events team and the activated civic campus. "As much as we do commend the design team, we want to also acknowledge the client/community stakeholders for bringing this program to the table."

## CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

### **An Example of City Response to Stormwater Emergencies**

MILLCREEK. The intense rainstorms in September and October overwhelmed the existing stormwater system at the intersection of 3000 S and 2700 East. In response, the city has taken swift action to address this critical flooding concern. Due to the storms, significant flooding occurred and a sinkhole formed on the road shoulder, posing a safety risk to drivers.

Understanding the urgency of the situation, Millcreek quickly mobilized to install new infrastructure to manage excess runoff from 3000 S. effectively. The upgrade includes a waterway, additional piping and drain inlet boxes, enhancing stormwater infrastructure and reducing the likelihood of future flooding.

This project is just one example of Millcreek's proactive response to emergencies over the past year. The city has addressed approximately five other emergency stormwater projects, primarily due to pipe failures that caused sinkholes on the roadway.

We remain committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of our community. This project represents our ongoing dedication to improving infrastructure and responding promptly to emergencies. Our ability to react swiftly to these emergencies would not be possible without the Stormwater Utility Fee (SUF).


