Mountaire Acres Receives Preservation Recognition

MILLCREEK. Thanks to the efforts of the Millcreek Historic Preservation Commission, in 2025 the Mountair Acres Subdivision was added to the National Register of Historic Places. The designation provides homeowners incentives toward preservation of the character of their neighborhood while retaining their rights to develop their property.

Mountair Acres was established in 1939 as one of Millcreek's earliest

subdivisions and is located to the east across Highland Drive from the city center, running approximately from 3000 South to 3150 South, and Highland Drive to Imperial Street.


this beautiful rug, reflecting the trees and birds in Mill Creek Canyon, made and donated it to the city. We are eternally grateful.

In general, the Chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also

submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
