Millcreek Celebrates New Affordable Housing in Millcreek

MILLCREEK. Community leaders, elected officials, and project partners gathered to celebrate the ribbon cutting of The Howick, a new affordable apartment community in Millcreek. Developed by Community Development Corporation of Utah (CDCU) and BlueLine Development, the property adds 150 affordable homes to Millcreek, helping address the growing need for safe, stable, and affordable housing in the region.

The Howick offers affordable rental homes for households earning approximately 30–60% of Area Median Income (AMI). The 150-unit community includes 41 one-bedroom, 40 two-bedroom, 41 three-bedroom, and 28 four-bedroom units and was designed with residents' long-term needs in mind, with emphasis on workforce family housing.

“This development represents more than just new housing — it represents stability, opportunity, and a stronger community,” says Todd Reeder, CEO of CDCU. “By bringing these affordable homes online, we are helping ensure that people who live and work in this community can remain here and thrive.”


Residents will also have access to on-site and referral-based supportive services provided by CDCU and First Step House. Through CDCU's Community Navigation program, residents can receive personalized, one-on-one support from HUD-certified housing counselors to address housing and financial stability needs, develop customized budgets and action plans, and connect to critical resources. First Step House, an established, local advocate for the area's homeless population and behavioral health provider, will be providing ongoing case management services for 11 units that have been set aside for people transitioning out of homelessness.

Local leaders highlight the broader impact of the project on the community. "Affordable housing is critical to the health and economic vitality of our city," shares Millcreek Mayor Cheri Jackson. "Projects like The Howick are possible because of strong partnerships and a shared commitment to ensuring everyone has a place to call home."

The development was made possible through collaboration among public, private, and nonprofit partners, including Millcreek City, Salt Lake County, State of Utah Olene Walker Housing Trust Fund, the Office of Homeless Services, Private Activity Bond, and Utah Housing Corporation. Financial partners include Cedar Rapids Bank & Trust and The Richman Group, which includes funding from American Express, Ally Bank, Key Bank, BMO, and Zions Bank. This collective effort reflects a shared commitment to expanding affordable housing options throughout Salt Lake County.

Sign Goes Up On The Westerly Apartments

MILLCREEK. Cottonwood Residential is nearing completion on The Westerly Apartments and **parking garage that will be shared with City Hall**. Layton Construction says they are on schedule to be done in June. There will be 197 apartment homes to rent, 7,500 square feet of ground floor restaurant and retail on Millcreek Common, and 448 much needed parking stalls.





In general, the Chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action. Keep Recycling Clean: How We Measure Contamination

Each month we collaborate with our recycling partner to process your single-stream recycling.

Through "Sample Sorts," we assess contamination rates by sorting a portion of the load into two categories:

- Accepted Recyclables: cardboard, paper, metal cans, plastic bottles, jugs, and tubs
- Non-Accepted Items and Garbage: items that cannot be recycled

We weigh each material and calculate the contamination rate. Recyclables are processed into new products and while contaminants are sent to the landfill.



Reducing contamination lowers disposal fees and minimizes environmental impact by reducing transportation trips. Please review the list of accepted items to avoid contamination and ensure more materials are recycled. Let's work together to keep contamination low!
