unincorporated part of Salt Lake County, and that meant our roads were largely at the mercy of county priorities. Unincorporated areas like Millcreek were left with less attention, fewer resources, and budgets that stayed flat year after year, even as inflation climbed and traffic steadily wore down our streets.

When Millcreek incorporated, residents celebrated the promise of local control. But we also inherited a tough reality: **179 linear miles of aging pavement** and a maintenance backlog built up over decades.

It didn't take long for road conditions to become one of the most common frustrations in our community—potholes multiplying, asphalt cracking, and surfaces deteriorating faster than we can patch them.

Even today, the challenge continues. Millcreek still lacks a dedicated Public Works crew for road maintenance and relies heavily on a county contract for services—an arrangement that hasn't been enough to keep our roads in the shape residents deserve.

At the same time, fuel-efficient vehicles are shrinking gas tax revenue, even as road repair costs rise. Inflation, Utah's freeze-thaw cycles, and aging asphalt are accelerating the damage. Many roads now need full reconstruction, but too often we can only afford temporary fixes—band-aids until long-term funding is secured.

The good news: Millcreek is not standing still. In the coming months, the city will host several open houses to share the facts, hear from residents, and build real solutions. The road ahead may be bumpy—but together, we can pave the way forward.

Update: Utah 100 Communities Renewable Energy Program

MILLCREEK. Millcreek continues to participate in the Utah 100 Communities —also known as Utah Renewable Communities (URC)—a statewide partnership of local governments working toward a shared goal of net-100% renewable electricity for participating communities by 2030. The program was made possible through state legislation adopted in 2019, creating a pathway for cities served by Rocky Mountain Power to collaborate on a large-scale clean energy initiative.

To join, Millcreek and other communities adopted formal resolutions and entered a governance agreement to guide the program’s development. By 2024, 19 communities had joined the effort—representing about a quarter of Rocky Mountain Power’s electricity sales in Utah. The program is now advancing through state regulatory review after Rocky Mountain Power filed its formal application with the Utah Public Service Commission in December of 2025. The Public Service Commission will determine rates, timelines, and other details about the program once it makes its ruling in the coming weeks. Once the Public Service Commission issues its ruling, communities will have 90 days to decide whether to participate in the program which will have a potential launch of late 2026 or early 2027.

Millcreek’s involvement reflects the City’s ongoing commitment to thoughtful sustainability, reliable service, and local choice. As the program moves closer to implementation, residents can expect continued updates, opportunities to learn more, and the ability to opt out if they choose. Together, our community is taking measured steps toward a cleaner, more resilient energy future.





Spring Cleanup Made Easy with Green Waste Service

The Wasatch Front Waste &
Recycling District*

Spring is here, lawns are waking up, and yard work is back. To help residents manage seasonal yard and garden waste, Wasatch Front Waste and Recycling District's Green Waste Can service begins **Monday, March 9, and runs through Friday, December 11.**

The Green Waste Can is designed for common yard materials such as grass clippings, leaves, garden debris, and small branches. This subscription-based program helps to keep these materials out of the landfill and frees up space in your regular trash container.

All green waste is delivered to the Salt Lake County Landfill composting facility, where it is processed into USCC-certified compost available for public purchase, supporting a local circular economy.
