Salt Lake County Awards Almost \$5.7 Million to Improve Transportation in Millcreek

MILLCREEK. This week, the Salt Lake County Council granted \$4.7 million to Millcreek and Holladay, and \$942,500 to Millcreek and Salt

The \$4.7 million grant from the County will be added to the \$4 million grant that Millcreek and Holladay have already procured from the federal government to rebuild 39th South east of 23rd East up to I-215. The roadway will be reconstructed, bike lanes and missing sidewalks added, curb and gutter improved to manage storm water, and transit stops enhanced.

Although the federal grant will not be available for several years, Millcreek and Holladay are working on ways to advance the funding. In the meantime, environmental and engineering work still need to be completed. So even if we had the full \$8.7 million in pocket right now, it would be at least a couple of years before the road was rebuilt.

The \$942,500 grant will be used by Millcreek and Salt Lake City to fund a study of multimodal ways (e.g., bikes, roads, buses, street cars) to improve traffic conditions and circulation linking Sugarhouse and Millcreek. The study will look specifically at extending the S-Line into Millcreek, as well as other transit alternatives.

For all of their assistance in helping to obtain these grants to improve our transportation, Mayor Silvestrini thanks Salt Lake County Mayor Ben McAdams, Councilmember Ann Granato, and the rest of the County Council, as well as Holladay Mayor Rob Dahle, SLC Mayor Jackie Buskipski and her CAN Administrative Deputy Director Jennifer McGrath, and Millcreek's lobbyists David and Ashley Spatafore. Parked Cars in Snowy Streets Cost Us All Money

MILLCREEK. There's no snow in the 10-day forecast. Nevertheless, we want to make a plea right now for your help during the rest of this winter's storms.

During the last storm, many vehicles left on the street caused unsafe conditions for the plows and their drivers, as well as for the parked vehicles. Snowplow operators had two bad choices: (1) risk hitting cars, or (2) skip streets altogether and return later (sometimes multiple times) to determine if roads could be safely cleared.

Please help us save your tax dollars by getting your cars off the street. When cars get hit, tax dollars must be used to defend against or pay the damage claims. When snow plows return to clear previously blocked streets, tax dollars pay the additional contract costs the County charges Millcreek for the additional snowplow services.

Our choices to help solve the problem include ticketing and towing cars, or possibly not plowing blocked streets at all (especially cul-de-sacs). These are choices you don't really want us to have to make. So please move your car off the street when its snowing or if there's snow on the street that needs plowing. It just costs us all more when you don't.

Just as a reminder: the law says, "No person shall park a vehicle on any city street when it is snowing or snow is on the street during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April." Millcreek [Ord. 11.20.130](#).

WFWRD WANTS TO KNOW WHAT YOU THINK



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
