Control Your Mosquitoes

"Did you know that mosquitoes are the most deadly animal on earth!? They claim more lives every year than sharks, snakes, dogs, crocodiles, lions, and humans combined. Mosquitoes have shaped world history by influencing the outcome of wars, and the success of colonization attempt. They still influence daily life in many parts of the world."

-- South Salt Lake Mosquito Abatement District (SSLVMAD)

MILLCREEK. As temperatures warm up and outdoor activities become more enjoyable, mosquito season is just around the corner. During the summer, nearly any water left standing for a week can provide suitable conditions for larval



mosquitoes to develop into adults. Mosquitoes complete their early life cycle in stagnant water in

places like ponds, marshy areas, gutters, cavities in trees, and bird baths.

SSLVMAD serves Millcreek and other areas of the Salt Lake Valley. Seasonal technicians regularly inspect known larval mosquito habitats and apply mosquito control measures as needed.

You can help control mosquitoes in your area:

- Eliminate unnecessary standing water from your property
- Empty and refresh desirable standing water at least weekly

Chosen from thousands of nominations across the country, Kitchen has made history as the first female driver to ever receive this award. She will be honored in May at a ceremony in New Orleans.



4500 South Renewal Project Update

UDOT has been working for the last few weeks on 4500 South from 700 East to I-215. Improvements will include repaving the road and repairing soft spots, reconstructing pedestrian ramps, and adding safety features to intersections.

Lanes will remain shifted for several more weeks. A new concrete median will be installed on the west leg of the 4500 South and Highland Drive intersection. Paving is anticipated to begin shortly.

Public Comment Policy and Procedure: The purpose of public comment is to allow citizens to address items on the agenda. Citizens requesting to address the commission may be asked to complete a written comment form and present it to the acting city recorder. In general, the chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be

considered at a future council meeting. The chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.

NOTICE OF ZONING MEETING

At its May 8, 2017 regular meeting, starting at 7:00 p.m., at the Mt. Olympus Improvement District, 3932 South 500 East, the Millcreek City Council will review and consider, among other matters to be announced before the meeting, changes to the following zoning ordinances:

- Eliminating the Mixed Development "MD-1" zone from the Zoning Ordinances of Millcreek. This zone has not been used in Millcreek and therefore is not needed to conduct City business.
