### **Millcreek Has its Own Old-School "Renaissance" Artist**

But Scott is not a painter, sculptor, or author. Instead, he practices the centuries-old art of frame-making, creating simple or grand frames for any style of art. "The art world equivalent of Ginger Rogers – in the sense of making the main attraction look good – frames have long subtly shaped the viewer's experience while being taken for granted." [J. Peder Zane, New York Times, 10/29/15.](#)

Scott takes pride in hand-making museum quality frames, but he also creates simple ones for us ordinary folks. All of his frames incorporate true woodworking joinery. They range from oil-rubbed hardwoods, to veneer or faux finishes, all the way to gilded frames in the museum work for which he is renowned. Clean and simple, or elaborately hand-carved from locally-sourced wood milled in his garage, each of Scott's frames is unique to its own "Fred Astaire."


Millcreek-born-and-raised, Scott's fruit-raising ancestors helped to settle East Millcreek. On graduation from Olympus High, Scott went to England, first on a church mission, then later to undertake a woodworking apprenticeship. On his return to Utah, Scott worked in several frame shops and galleries before deciding to open his own business to do framing "right." He currently works out of his house in Millcreek on 9th East at 3060 South.

The moniker "second artist" was given to the top student of a Renaissance master, the one tasked with finishing, framing and delivering a piece to its owner. Scott initially embraced this title for himself, founding his business "The Second Artist" in 1983. He now has his own second artist: Adrienne Winter, the head framer at the Phillips Gallery in Salt Lake, has been apprenticing with Scott for the last several years. She hand-carved the frame corners in the photo below. Now in her fourth year of study with Scott, Adrienne is a hard-working

quick study, whose work has made it possible for the return of such old techniques as true [water gilt framing](#).

In all that he does, Scott remains aware of the context in which his work exists. His frames are not merely frames -- they work with the artwork they hold to create a beautiful presentation. He is well aware that everything is beautiful and worth appreciating-- even the structures that hold up masterpieces.

Although his frames are works of art in and of themselves, Scott says, "The most important work a framer can do is protect the work of art it surrounds." He recommends you look at your framed pieces – is there corrugated cardboard on the back? Is the bevel of the matting yellowing or brown? These are red flags that might affect the value of your piece. Go see Scott. He can help you -- with your ill-framed pieces and with your unframed art. Check out his Facebook page [here](#).

## ELECTION INFORMATION

The following municipal offices up for election this year are: Mayor, Council District 1, and Council District 3. The period for eligible candidates to file a declaration of candidacy is **June 3-7, 2019, 8 am - 5 pm** at Millcreek City Hall.

***What are the ways an individual can declare candidacy during the declaration period?***

1. The candidate appears in person at the Recorder's office during business hours (8 am to 5 pm).

2. *The candidate designates an agent to appear in person at the Recorder's office on her or his behalf. The candidate must be located outside of Utah during the entire declaration period to qualify.*
3. *An individual nominates a candidate by filing a petition in person at the Recorder's office.*

*These methods require specific paperwork be completed and a \$50 filing fee be paid.*

#### **Can an individual declare candidacy for more than one office?**


*No, an individual cannot file a declaration of candidacy for more than one office in Utah during any election year. This does not prohibit an individual from filing as a write-in candidate for the same office, nor does it prohibit an individual who currently holds another elected office from declaring candidacy for a municipal office.*

#### **What are the qualifications to become a municipal candidate?**

- *The candidate is a United States citizen.*
- *The candidate is a registered voter.*
- *The candidate has resided within the municipality for the 12 consecutive months immediately before the date of the election.*
- *If the candidate is seeking a city council position that is elected from a district, she or he must be a resident of the district.*
- *If the candidate resides in an area that was recently annexed by the municipality, they must have resided in the annexed area for the 12 consecutive months before the election.*
- *If the candidate has been convicted of a felony, her or his right to hold office has been restored in accordance with Utah Code 20A-2-101.5(3).*
- *If the candidate has been convicted of treason or crime against the elective franchise (i.e., crimes defined in state election law), her or his right to hold office has been restored by meeting the requirements of Utah Code 20A-2-101.3.*
- *The candidate must not be mentally incompetent.*
